Entry Requirements:

- Candidates should already be working as a registered manager, unit, deputy or assistant manager in a health and social care service for adults.
- Ideal for those that have achieved the Level 3 Diploma in Health and Social Care (Adults) or the Level 4 Diploma in Adult Care.

Overview:

This is a great opportunity for newly appointed or existing managers of residential based services to learn a variety of key management skills and build knowledge which will support them in their management role.

To successfully achieve this qualification you will guide and inspire teams to make positive differences to someone's life when they are faced with physical, practical, social, emotional, psychological or intellectual challenges. You will lead a care team and will develop and implement a values-based culture at a service or unit level. You may be responsible for business development, financial control, organisational resilience and continuity as well as for managing risk and leading on organisational change.

End Point Assessment

End point assessment or "EPA" has been created to assess the knowledge, skills and behaviours gained throughout the qualification. EPA is conducted by an external independent body chosen by the employer. EPA offers the chance to showcase your skills and be awarded a grade that reflects your performance. EPA will consist of the below activities:

- Observation of leadership (2 stages; 60 min observation & 15 min post observation questioning)
